Rector's Writ

With all the busyness that goes on September through May, we find ourselves looking for a little relief and respite in summer. It often seems that when life is busy, prayer is one of those disciplines that get pushed aside too easily.

Nothing can replace prayer. Our spiritual well runs dry if we don't make time to be in the Lord's presence to hear and adore him. We find wholeness and peace with God when we give prayer and worship their proper place and priority in our lives. In so many circumstances to be endured, we come to realize that prayer is one of the BEST things we can do for others and for ourselves.

Our Prayer Book is a wonderful resource for prayer and reflection. Whether you do the daily office of Morning or Evening Prayer; the Daily Devotions for Individuals and Families (pgs. 136-140); Compline (pg. 127); or weave a few of these into your own prayer time, there are some gems to consider and use. Following are a few samples, but no doubt you'll find more to enjoy in the BCP.

O heavenly Father, who has filled the world with beauty: Open our eyes to behold your gracious hand in all your works; that, rejoicing in your whole creation, we may learn to serve you with gladness; for the sake of him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen (For Joy in God's Creation, p. 814 BCP)

O God, in the course of this busy life, give us times of refreshment and peace; and grant that we may so use our leisure to rebuild our bodies and renew our minds, that our spirits may be opened to the goodness of your creation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (For the Good Use of Leisure, p. 825 BCP)

Everliving God, whose will it is that all should come to you through your Son Jesus Christ: Inspire our witness to him, that all may know the power of his forgiveness and the hope of his resurrection; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen. (For the Mission of the Church, p. 816-17)

Almighty God, we entrust all who are dear to us to your never-failing care and love, for this life and the life to come, knowing that you are doing for them better things than we can desire or pray for; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (For those we Love, p. 831)

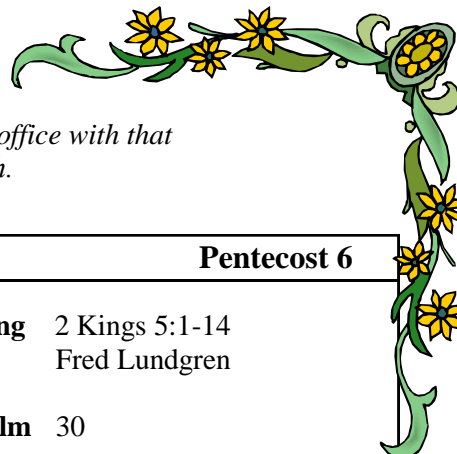

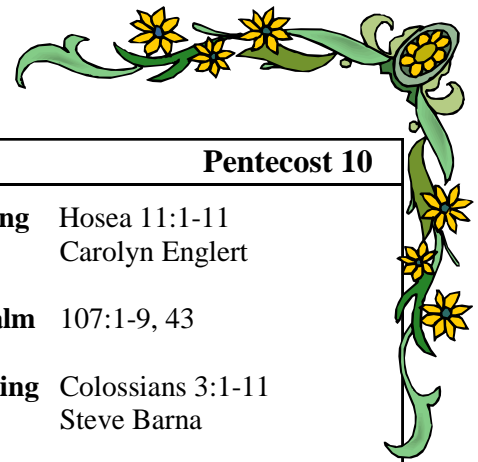

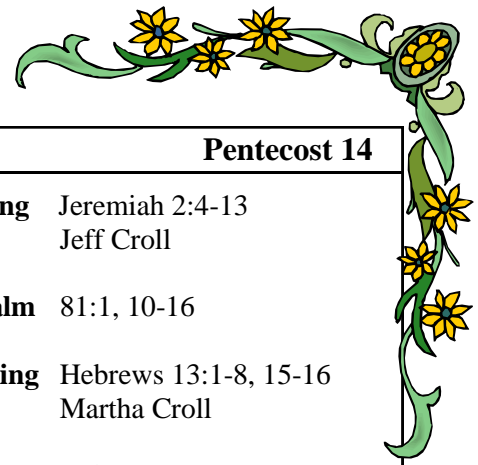

Fathers (and Mothers) and Friends

Jonathan Myrick Daniels

Jon Daniels was born in New Hampshire in 1939, the son of a Congregationalist physician. While recovering from a serious injury during his high school years, the month-long hospital stay gave him ample time for reflection. It was then that he decided to join the Episcopal Church, take his schoolwork more seriously, and consider the possibility of entering the priesthood. After high school, he enrolled at Virginia Military Institute (VMI) where, although he seemed a misfit, he stuck it out and was selected valedictorian of his graduating class. However, during his sophomore year, he had begun to experience uncertainties about his faith, perhaps brought on by the death of his father and the serious illness of his younger sister. As a result, he entered Harvard University in the fall of 1961 to study for his master's degree in English Literature. However, during Easter Services in 1962 he underwent a conversion experience and what he called a "renewal of grace." After a year of work to repair the family finances, he enrolled fall 1963 at Episcopal Theological Seminary (ETS) in Cambridge, Massachusetts, expecting to graduate in the spring of 1966.

In March 1965, Dr. Martin Luther King asked students and others to join him in Selma, Alabama, for a march on the state capital in Montgomery. Jon and several of his fellow seminarians decided to go. However, he and a friend missed the bus back and began to consider how an in-and-out visit must appear to those living in Montgomery, Selma, and the surrounding area. They decided they needed to stay longer and requested permission to remain in Alabama, study on their own, and return to ETS to take exams in May. The faculty agreed. Jon completed his second year of seminary in good order and then returned in Alabama in July.

In mid-August, Jon and others went to Fort Deposit, Alabama, to join in the picketing of three local businesses. They were arrested and held in the county jail in Hayneville for six days until they all made bail. On Friday, August 20, four of the newly released demonstrators attempted to enter a local shop that would serve non-whites but were met at the door by a man with a shotgun who told them to leave or be shot. After a brief confrontation, the man aimed the gun at Ruby Sales, a young black girl in the party. Jon pushed her out of the way and took the shotgun blast himself. He died instantly. The man was tried and found innocent of murder on the grounds of self-defense—he claimed Ruby had a knife, which was unlikely since she had just been released from jail.

The verdict stunned the Episcopal Church. The murder of an educated, white, unarmed seminarian who was defending an unarmed teenage girl shocked the church into facing the reality of racial inequality in which it had tacitly participated in the past and continued. Bishop Duncan Gray, Jr., who was serving the Episcopal Church in Meridian, Mississippi, has characterized this single event as the galvanizing point in the Church's move toward equality for all, not as a concept but as a practice. Ruby Sales went on to attend ETS herself and now works as a human rights advocate in Washington, DC, where she has established an inner-city mission dedicated to Jon. The Episcopal Church designated Jon a modern martyr of the church in 1991 and designated August 14, the day of his arrest, as a day of remembrance of his sacrifice and that of all the martyrs of the Civil Rights Movement.

Prayer: O God of justice and compassion, who put down the proud and the Mighty from their place, and lift up the poor and afflicted: We give you thanks for your faithful witness Jonathan Myrick Daniels, who, in the midst of injustice and violence, risked and gave his life for another; and we pray that we, following his example, may make no peace with oppression; through Jesus Christ the just one: who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
