Rector's Writ

Not so long ago, we had boots and coats and heat on to help us endure winter. Spring has officially arrived, and we find ourselves trying to be faithful in observing a holy Lent, being faithful in and keeping our disciplines throughout. Within a few days, those Lenten disciplines and observations will intensify as we prepare for Holy Week. We know how the story unfolds: the last supper; Christ's prayers in Gethsemane; betrayal; denial; the trial and crucifixion; death, grief, and silence. Like some of the disciples, we tend to have a response for almost anything. As we recall our Lord's teachings, his suffering and death, and the shadows cast during Holy Week, so often our main response is silence. Some years it's difficult to enter and embrace that silence. Sometimes we want explanations; we want life to be different; we want life to be fair. The Holy Week stories we read and listen to are not about fairness, but faithfulness: Christ's love and faith in the Father; the Father and the Son's abiding, enduring love for humanity.

The point of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection is our salvation and redemption. Jesus did what we could not do for ourselves and restored us to a right relationship with God. The renewed life we see each spring is one reminder of the renewing love, hope, and grace we're given through Jesus Christ our Savior. Please invite and plan to bring family and friends with you for Holy Week and Easter services. The joy of Easter is an empty cross, an empty tomb, and hearts filled with praise, glory, and worship offered gladly to our risen Lord.

O God, who by the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light: Grant that we, who have been raised with him, may abide in his presence and rejoice in the hope of eternal glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be dominion and praise for ever and ever. Amen. (Easter Week Prayer, BCP p.223)

Christ is alive! Let Christians sing. His cross stands empty to the sky. Let streets and homes with praises ring. His love in death shall never die.

Christ is alive! His Spirit burns through this and every future age,

till all creation lives and learns his joy, his justice, love, and praise. (Hymn #182 Christ is Alive!)

A blessed Holy Week and a blessed, joyful Easter to you and those you love.

Keeping Members Safe & Locking Doors

Following Sgt. Andrew Wert's March 5th presentation on the FBI's Active Shooter Training ("Run, Hide, Fight"), it was made clear that simply locking doors can discourage a potential 'active shooter.' In an effort to do what we can to keep Grace Church members safe in these uneasy times, the vestry decided we will continue *locking all doors, including the front church doors, 10 minutes after each service starts.* We're trying to be sure members are aware of this, so if you know there's a chance you'll be late, you might plan to let a friend know (maybe by text) when you've arrived to be let in. We don't want to discourage anyone from attending just because they're running late. We also want to be sure we're taking measures to help keep all Grace Church members safe. We still need volunteers to help with locking all doors in the church and parish hall about 10 minutes after each service starts, then re-opening doors so members can get to coffee hour. Our 8 o'clockers have this covered, but we still need weekly help with volunteers to cover this concern at the 10am service. Please let one or the wardens—Barb Popiel or Carol Marotta—or the rector know if you can help. THANK YOU!!

Selling the Kitchen Stove

During our most recent fire inspection, we learned that to continue using the commercial stove we have in the parish hall kitchen, we'll be paying \$500-600 a year for inspection of the fire suppression system above the stove. With feedback from Building & Grounds and some members, vestry has opted to sell and/or remove the current stove. If you know of any service organizations, clubs, etc. that might be interested in purchasing the stove, please let us know. It still works fine and in a place that has plenty of room, it could be put to good use. If we can't sell it, we may consider donating it to a non-profit group or other alternatives. We plan to replace it

with one large size household gas oven. We only need the fire suppression system on commercial stoves. Obviously removing the stove AND the hood above it (which contains exhaust fans and the fire suppression system) will take some planning, and we need to keep the Building & Grounds group in the loop with that.

Please contact the Jr. Warden, Carol Marotta or the rector if you have any leads or know of any group or individual that may be interested. FYI: The ten burner, two-oven stove is a **Peerless Professional Cooking Equipment** brand. The hood that contains the exhaust fans and fire suppression system is from **Sturdi-Bilt Restaurant Equipment.** We're not sure when it was purchased/installed, how long it's been in use, or where to start for an asking price. If anyone can be of help, or has a contact person, please let us know. Thank you.
