### Rector's Writ

We know that in order to celebrate Christmas joyfully, it helps to do the spiritual preparation—listening, reflection, and prayer—the Advent season calls us to work on.

We find it's seldom easy making time to be in God's loving presence when there are so many demands and preparations that are part of the holidays. From Thanksgiving on it seems we're in high gear with any number of things that can prevent us (if we're not careful and deliberate) from keeping close to God, from reflecting on Jesus' life and teachings, or from simple prayer...whether we're praying at church, in the kitchen, or in the car. Advent and Christmas are holy seasons, encircled with a sense of the spiritual, sacred, and often mysterious ways and works of God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit.

Certainly at Christmas we embrace the hope, joy, and peace that God gives us all in the life of his Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. Below are a few prayers and thoughts to offer as we journey through these holy seasons with the Lord who makes them holy.

"My God, what joy it is when you come to us in daily visitation; what peace is ours when by your coming we find life anew. Come, O come to live with us and reign within, now and forever. Amen." (from A Guide to Prayer for All God's People; R. Job, N. Shawchuck, p.42)

"The world is the place where we meet God because it is the place where God meets us in the person of Jesus Christ. Christ did not merely inhabit human flesh; he became flesh. He made himself, as God, to be one with humanity in the concrete, historical realities of human life. Truly, God has entered into the world and it is in the world that Christians must turn to find God." (ibid, p. 44; from Merton's Palace of Nowhere by James Finley)

"O God, who wonderfully created, and yet more wonderfully restored, the dignity of human nature: Grant that we may share the divine life of him who humbled himself to share our humanity, your Son Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen." (BCP, p. 214)

The commercial world ignores Advent, moving immediately from Halloween, sliding through Thanksgiving, and bombarding us with the worldly trappings of a secular season of Christmas, one that often begins before all the Halloween candy is eaten. If you are as tired of this as I am, I invite you to consider the following piece written by Joan Sheldon. I found it years ago in some devotional literature, tucked it away, and somehow it rose to the surface again this year. May you have a Christ-filled Advent!

## ADVENT by Joan Sheldon

Advent comes quietly.

Between the feasting on turkey
And the riotous potlatch of Christmas,
Advent comes silently;
Like the first winter snow
that falls in the night.

The purple color of penitence

Competes with:

the reds and greens
the gold and silver tinsel
