#### Rector's Writ

Bishop Hollingsworth recently sent a letter to parish clergy and wardens issuing new guidelines for in-person worship, meetings, and other parish gatherings. Our 10am Holy Eucharist on May 23rd was the first service in over a year with Prayer Books and Hymnals back in the pew racks and with hymns being sung. To say members were surprised and happy to see those books and sing hymns is an understatement!

Re indoor gatherings, all members are still to maintain social distancing, with the exception of families of the same household. With the same exception, we also continue to limit the passing of the Peace to no physical contact. We will continue to receive communion in one kind (bread) only. Masks are required for indoor worship and gatherings, 'except while preaching, reading lessons or intercessions, officiating, (etc.), so long as such persons are fully vaccinated' (that is two weeks after receiving a single dose vaccine or two weeks after having the second of a two dose vaccine). As already mentioned, singing is allowed in 'quiet voices' and with masks.

A few coffee hour hosts and members have discussed the need to follow safe protocols for coffee hour. We plan to offer coffee and refreshments (individual portions by a masked hostess/host) and fellowship after each service **beginning June 6th** (optional of course, with masks and distancing still necessary except while eating). Although the COVID risks dictated safe (but not-at-all-easy) changes, our fellowship gathering after church is one of the things we've missed most. Our thanks to those hosting coffee hour in the past and those helping our fellowship get re-started. Marsha will have a coffee host sign-up sheet on the back table. We hope to have more fellowship and more volunteers than ever.

The new Guidelines/Protocols for In-Person Gathering are posted on the diocesan web site (www.dohio.org), and we'll have copies available at church as well. As always, we appreciate your patience and cooperation in providing a safe place for worship, fellowship, meetings, and activities. The rector and vestry will continue reviewing the guidelines and invite your comments and suggestions. As ever, we welcome your continued prayers and support as our

Lord guides and upholds our Grace Church family and all people with his abiding love and goodness.



# Fathers (and Mothers) and Friends

#### **By Bette Brooks**

They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still. The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.

#### Justin Martyr, Philosopher, Apologist, and Martyr

June 1

Justin was born around 100 (both his birth and death dates are approximate) at Flavia Neapolis (ancient Shechem, modern Nablus) in Samaria (the middle portion of Israel, between Galilee and Judea) of pagan Greek parents. He was brought up with a good education in rhetoric, poetry, and history. He studied various schools of philosophy in Alexandria and Ephesus, joining himself first to Stoicism, then Pythagoreanism, then Platonism, looking for answers to his questions. While at Ephesus, he was impressed by the steadfastness of the Christian martyrs, and by the personality of an aged Christian man whom he met by chance while walking on the seashore. This man spoke to him about Jesus as the fulfilment of the promises made through the Jewish prophets. Justin was overwhelmed. "Straightway a flame was kindled in my soul," he writes, "and a love of the prophets and those who are friends of Christ possessed me."

Justin became a Christian, but he continued to wear the cloak that was the characteristic uniform of the professional teacher of philosophy. His position was that pagan philosophy, especially Platonism, is not simply wrong, but is a partial grasp of the truth, and serves as "a schoolmaster to bring us to Christ." He engaged in debates and disputations with non-Christians of all varieties—pagans, Jews, and heretics. He opened a school of Christian philosophy and accepted students, first at Ephesus and then later at Rome. There he engaged the Cynic philosopher Crescens in debate, and soon after was arrested on the charge of practicing an unauthorized religion. It has been suggested that Crescens lost the debate and denounced Justin to the authorities out of spite. He was tried before the Roman prefect Rusticus, refused to renounce Christianity, and was put to death by beheading along with six of his students, one of them a woman. A record of the trial, probably authentic, is preserved, known as *The Acts of Justin the Martyr*.

#### Prayer

Almighty and everlasting God, who found your martyr Justin wandering from teacher to teacher, seeking the true God, and revealed to him the sublime wisdom of your eternal Word: Grant that all who seek you, or a deeper knowledge of you, may find and be found by you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
