Our committee is going to try to maintain a bulletin board in fellowship hall, under the projection screen. The purpose will be to remind all of us to think of ways to bring folks to church. The postings might even include things about racial bias. In this crazy world some would have us think that "social justice" is a bad concept. We need to remember that social justice is a tenet of nearly every Protestant and Catholic religion.

Now, changing direction a bit, I have just posted an article that recently appeared in the *Record Courier* around the beginning of Lent. If you missed it, you might want to take a look at it because it ties into our own beliefs and our own Grace Episcopal's mission statement, I think.

In addition, nearly everyone on our committee participated in the Lenten Program put together by Rev. Carol and Carolyn Englert, the latter of whom moderated the sessions. A lot of other folks were there, too. The purpose of the program was to heal, to learn how to let go. On Good Friday there was a short clip on the *Today Show* with Bishop T. D. Jakes. Fathers (and Mothers) and Friends

They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still. The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.

Erik, King of Sweden, Martyr

May 18

The story of Erik, King of Sweden, is one of historical fact, folklore, and myth, rather like that of King Arthur. We know he was indeed the ruler of Sweden for about a decade and we know how he died. Much of the rest is conjecture and speculation.

Nothing is known of Erik's early life. He emerges in legends that say in 1150 he was selected as King of Sweden (not the entire country we know today but of Svraland, the historical core region of Sweden) unanimously in 1150. His power was strengthened by his marriage to Christina, Princess of Denmark—the Danes were a powerful people in medieval times.

Erik IX Jedvardsson was ruler of much of Sweden from 1150 to 1160. He was the head of a Christian kingdom with nearby pagan kingdoms, all sharing an old tradition of fighting. Around 1155, he headed an expedition into Finland, then loosely under Swedish rule, to consolidate Swedish authority there and to establish a protected Christian mission, headed by Henry of Uppsala, now considered the founder of the Church in Finland. Erik is also known for undertaking to provide Sweden with fair laws and fair courts, and for measures designed to assist the poor and the infirm.

As he was in church on May 18, 1160, the day after Ascension Day, he was told that a pagan Danish army was approaching to kill him. He replied, "Let us at least finish the sacrifice. The rest of the feast I shall keep elsewhere." As he was leaving the church with his small band of nobles, the pagans rushed upon him and killed him by beheading.

Erik was honored both as an upholder of the Christian faith and as a national hero, the ancestor of a long line of Swedish kings. Within thirty years after his death his name appeared on the Swedish Calendar, and he is accounted the principal patron of Sweden, as Patrick is of Ireland. The silver casket with his remains still rests in the cathedral at Uppsala. When questions arose in this century about the legitimacy of the remains, the casket was opened and revealed the bones of a man, from the same time period as Erik, who head had been severed before death. The casket was returned to its sacred place.

PRAYER:

O God, who called your servant Erik of Sweden to an earthly throne that he might advance your heavenly kingdom, and gave him zeal for your Church and love for your people: Mercifully grant that we who commemorate him this day may be fruitful in good works, and attain to the glorious crown of your saints; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
