Rector's Writ

This Writ is an effort to provide a brief report on the surveys returned regarding the suggestion of combining to one gam service and to re-starting Sunday School (which we found an interest in general Christian Formation for all, not just children & youth). A majority of those responding were willing to attend one gam service. The comments and suggestions though made it clear we have a lot of gray area on this issue. The vestry reviewed the survey comments at our April 25th meeting. After much discussion and deliberation, the vestry voted to keep the service schedule as it is. The rector supports this decision as well, and any members with comments or questions are welcome to call or set up a time to meet with the rector to discuss these.

One of the main concerns is that it doesn't seem wise to make a change that would cause us to lose ANY members. In an effort to attract new members, we'd be pushing aside the worship preferences—and the long time support and service—of some members. We certainly want to do what brings new people in, yet we certainly want to be sure we minister to our members supporting and participating at Grace Church now.

The vestry and rector support the idea of a combined service for special events, especially those where we're trying to bring in new members, and for fellowship as well. We discussed a possible quarterly 'combined service' to invite new people, but also to increase the fellowship among members who attend the two services.

The first step is determining a) what church growth programs or events and b) what Christian Ed/Formation programs will help us with that difficult task of bringing new members to Grace Church. Of course there are no easy answers to any of this.

We're blessed in many ways by the people who attend and support Grace Church. We ask for your continued prayers, presence, and support so we can explore and take some risks with programs or events to attract new people while avoiding the lure of quick solutions that might cause some of our family to leave their church home. Church growth—in the Spirit and in numbers—is a process that takes some time and a lot of people willing to work and pray to help make it happen.

Fathers (and Mothers) and Friends

They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still. The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.

Simon of Cyrene May 12

There are many who were present during the time from Jesus's trial to his resurrection, people about whom we know little at all, sometimes, not even their names. For example, have you ever wondered how the maid in the courtyard recognized Peter? Had she followed our Lord and seen the disciples around Him? Or the centurion who won Jesus's robe? Lloyd C. Douglas wrote a best-selling novel <u>The Robe</u> in 1942 that remained on the New York Times Fiction Best Seller List for nearly a year. And there are many more.

However, there is one person whose name we know. As Jesus was carrying his cross out of Jerusalem to the place of execution, a man named Simon of Cyrene was coming in, and the soldiers compelled him to carry the cross of Jesus. This referred to the legal right of a soldier to require a provincial to carry his gear one mile for him. He is mentioned only in synoptic Gospels; John says Jesus carried the cross himself. Mark identifies him as "the father of Alexander and Rufus" without further explanation, apparently taking it for granted that his readers would all know who Rufus and Alexander are. It is believed that Mark originally wrote his Gospel, the earliest one written, for the Christian community in Rome. This suggests that Alexander and Rufus were well known to, and probably part of, the Christian congregation there.

Did Simon become a Christian? We don't know. He came from Cyrene, a Greek city in the province of Cyrenaica, in eastern Libya (northern Africa), where there was a sizeable Jewish community. Jews had been forced to settle there and it was an early center of Christianity. The Cyrenian Jews also had a temple in Jerusalem where many went for annual feasts. Could Simon have been in Jerusalem for Passover? Could his two sons have accompanied him? Could this have been their introduction to Christianity? So many questions; so few answers.

PRAYER:

Heavenly Father, whose most dear Son, as He walked the way of The Cross, accepted the service of Simon of Cyrene to carry his physical burden for him: grant us each the grace gladly to bear one another's burdens, for the love of him who said, "As you did it to the least of these my brethren, you did it to me," your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
