Fathers (and Mothers) and Friends

They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still. The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.

Southern author Eudora Welty wrote that Southerners not only listen \underline{to} the story; we listen \underline{for} the story, a skill born of playing quietly under the bushes that surrounded the porch, listening to the adult conversation in the cool of the evening (before air conditioning!), hoping the adults would forget we were there. I get a similar sense of listening \underline{for} the story each November when I see our list of friends and family who have entered God's nearer presence. What are the stories of faith here? What are the lessons we have learned from these saints who lived among us? Below is a story of one of my saints.

Rev. Dr. Russell Hurd, Minister and Educator

1945-July 9, 2023

I first met Russ in 2000 when the two of us were working to create the full undergraduate programs for the newly-created state teaching license in Middle Childhood education at Kent State's Kent and Stark Campuses. His calm demeanor, obvious intelligence, and gentle sense of humor made the hours of meetings (filled with arguments and frustration) possible.

Russ was born in Warren, Ohio, in 1945. He grew up in Kent and graduated from the now-closed Kent State University School (1962) and Oberlin College (B.A., 1966). He answered the call to the ministry and attended Chicago Theological Seminary, graduating with his Master of Divinity (M.Div.) degree in 1969. While serving United Methodist churches in Ohio and Delaware, he attended Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. and received his Doctor of Ministry degree (D.Min.) in 1979. He resigned from the ministry in 1990 and entered graduate school in educational psychology at Kent State, receiving his Ph.D. in 1996. While working on his doctorate, Russ began teaching part-time at Kent's Stark and Tuscarawas Campuses. He retired as a tenured assistant professor at the Stark Campus in 2008 and continued teaching part-time there until 2013. I met him during his service as coordinator of the Department of Education at the Stark Campus, a position he held from 2000-2008. In his Ph.D. studies and his teaching, he blended his two professional careers into the research he conducted on childhood bereavement experiences.

I learned much from Russ about the importance of questions. Participating in meetings with him was always challenging—his questions and comments went to the heart of the issue at hand, often uncomfortably so. "To get the right answer, Bette, we have to ask the right questions," he'd say when I grew impatient with discussions. He must have led us into many right questions; the two programs became the model for the program at Kent State Geauga-Twinsburg and has not needed alteration since approval in 2001. When Russ learned that I was a single parent to 14-year-old twins after David's death, his pastoral counseling side showed clearly. His careful questions about Amanda and Beverly were phrased in such a way that I saw that the ideas behind them were actually suggestions. His funeral at The Bath Church was packed with family, friends, colleagues, and former students, not a spare seat anywhere. We had all come to honor a good and decent man who asked hard questions participated in answering them.
