Some are simply what people are trying to get accustomed to: health changes, energy limitations, or even aches and pains that weren't so noticeable are now demanding to be noticed. Of course COVID is in a category all by itself, and nobody wants to deal with that, but some of us have.

It's more than a bit of a comfort to know that we have our Grace Church family praying for those who are facing sickness, ailments, diseases, or in the hospital. The people of Grace have always been people of prayer and faith. As several of our members have said, we pray for those we know and love because we believe in our Lord's healing power and goodness. We pray because we know—from experience or from the Spirit—prayer makes a difference.

So we ask for your continued prayers for all the members of our Grace family who are facing any kind of sickness, sorrow, need, or adversity. We believe God is good. We trust that God hears our prayers, even when they're less than elegant and sometimes rambling.

Please know: your prayers, your presence, your kindness are part of being about the work of God's kingdom...and they're appreciated more that we might imagine. God can use any number of not-so-major ways to bring blessings to someone's life just when we need it most. May God find us to be faithful servants, willing to serve and follow our Lord; willing to serve and do good that benefits others and glorifies our Father.

Safety Measures

The Vestry discussed concerns some members have expressed regarding safety from shootings in places of worship. Active Shooter Training; possible local law enforcement training; the ALICE program (Alert, lock down, inform, counter, and evacuate); and the suggestion from a few members to hire an armed guard were among the things discussed. We'll be exploring the options. We agreed one immediate measure to take on Sunday mornings is locking ALL Church & building access doors by 8:10am and 10:10am and plan to begin that September 4th. We will need volunteers to help make sure this gets done each Sunday. If you'd be willing to help with this please let one of our vestry members or the rector know.

Fathers (and Mothers) and Friends

They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still. The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.

David Pendleton Oakerhater, Deacon & Missionary

September 1

David P. Oakerhater (born around 1847) was a warrior and leader of the Cheyenne Indians of Oklahoma. His Cheyenne name was O-kuh-ha-tuh, meaning Making Medicine. He led a group of fighters against the United States government in a dispute over Indian land rights. In 1875, he and 27 other military leaders were taken prisoner by the U S Army and sent to a military prison in Florida.

The conditions there were very poor. The men slept on the concrete floor, had only the clothes they had worn when captured, and were shackled at all times. Thanks to the efforts of a concerned Army captain, Richard Henry Pratt, their shackles were removed, they learned English, were encouraged to earn money by giving art and archery lessons to visitors, and encountered the Christian faith. David and three others were moved to become Christians and, when given the opportunity, traveled north to study for the ministry.

David was baptized (and took the name "David") at Grace Episcopal Church in Syracuse, New York, in 1878, and was ordained to the diaconate in 1881 at the same church. He returned to Oklahoma, founded schools and missions, and continued to work among his people as a Native American chief and holy man until his death on August 31, 1931. He was designated a saint in the Episcopal Church in 1985, and Grace Episcopal Church (Syracuse) became a national shrine to him in 2005.

When he first returned to Oklahoma in 1881, he told his people:

You all know me. You remember when I led you out to war, I went first, and what I told you was true. Now I have been away to the East, and I have learned about another captain, the Lord Jesus Christ, and He is my leader. He goes first, and all He tells me is true. I come back to my people to tell you to go with me now in this new road, a war that makes all for peace.

PRAYER:

O God of unsearchable wisdom and infinite mercy, who chose a captive warrior, David Oakerhater, to be your servant, and sent him to be a missionary to his own people and to exercise the office of a deacon among them: Liberate us, who commemorate him today, from bondage to self, and empower us for service to you and to the neighbors you have given us; through Jesus Christ, the captain of our salvation; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen.
