Rector's Writ

Annual meetings are over and budgets are approved, we Episcopalians make the effort to lead our focus back to spiritual matters. The Ash Wednesday liturgy invites us to tune our inner compass and outer lives to "the observance of a holy Lent." The word 'observance' is somewhat deceptive because it sounds so do-able. Anyone can OBSERVE, right? We observe that it stays light a little longer each day. During Lent we observe the tone of worship is more solemn, and there are no flowers on the altar.

Yet in our observance of a holy lent, we're called beyond what we can see. We're called to make a commitment from within by "self examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; by reading and meditating on God's holy word." The irony of this inner commitment is that it opens us to God's presence, holy mysteries, and grace at work in our worship, our relationships, and our lives.

Whenever we are disciplined enough or bold enough to do this annual inspection and reflection, we realize there are a few gaps in our lives. We sin and miss the mark, and all that can fill those gaps is the grace of God. We find hope and meaning, not in what we turn away from or take on during Lent, but in the LORD WE TURN TOWARD in worship, faith, and humility. Our penitence is answered with God's forgiveness...our reflection with God's guidance...our hope with God's grace. An old work, Little Book of Contemplation, has a meditation reminding us of the source and reason for our hope.

"I thank you, O Lord, because You have made me after Your own image...that I should always be mindful of You, think upon You, and love You. But..my selfishness has so defaced your image within me that I cannot accomplish the purpose of my being except You continually renew and reform me. ...Grant that I may comprehend the magnitude of Your boundless love. So great is that charity that nothing greater or better can be conceived. You are righteous, truthful, blessed.

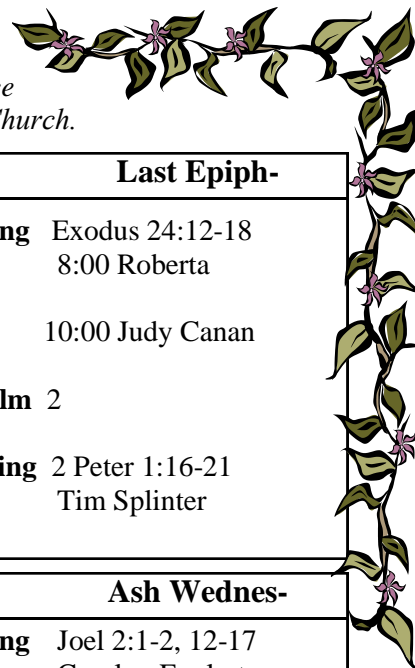
In that You are righteous above all comparison, how do You spare (us)?... Although You are completely and exceedingly righteous, yet You are gentle toward sinners because You are completely and exceedingly good. ...Hence, the cause of the divine mercy is the complete and exceeding goodness of God."

Trusting in that goodness, may we each observe a holy Lent.



Service and Lay Ministry Schedule

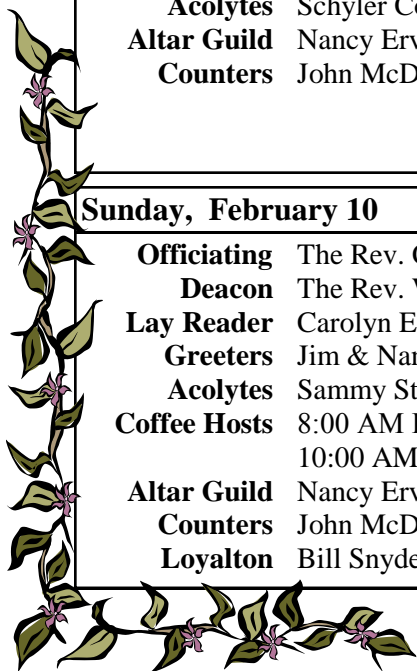

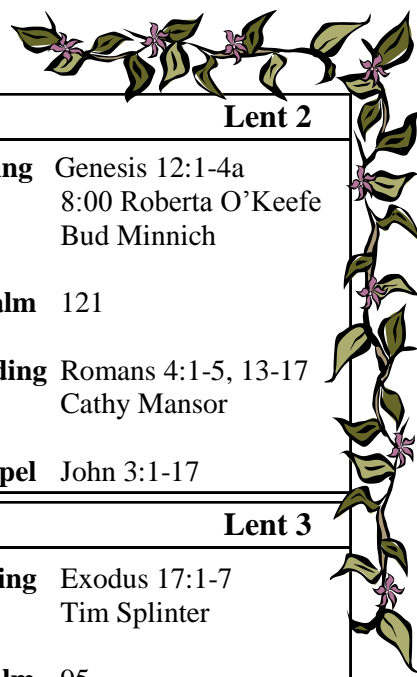

Bishop Arthur Williams will be here for confirmation on Sunday, February 24th. A covered dish lunch will follow, so please sign up in the Parish Hall.

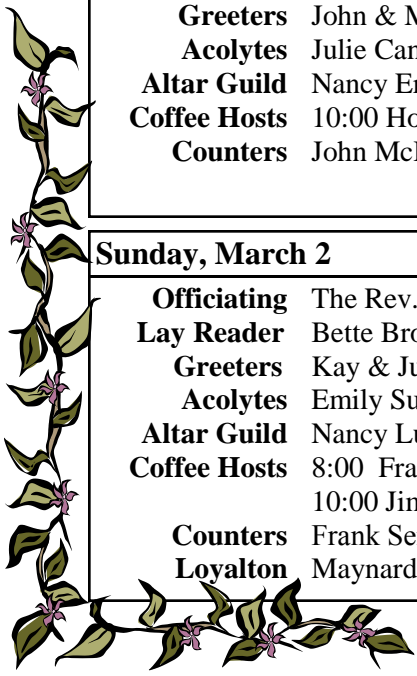
