Rector's Reflections

As our Church calendar begins a new year with Advent, we're called to watchfulness, waiting, and preparation. "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." (Isaiah. 40:3) At one level we know that preparation must include some spiritual nurturing and a time for listening and quiet reflection. The reason for such preparation is remembering and celebrating the birth of Christ. Yet the secular focus of Christmas is more than a subtle contrast to the paths we're to explore during Advent.

Watch, wait, and prepare has become more of a focus on shopping, bargains, and the constant lure of retailers to buy early. We're already hearing news of people waiting in lines to buy the latest Elmo doll or IPODs or whatever items are in big demand and short supply. It's more difficult to practice patience and preparing our hearts for God when retailers don't even wait until Halloween is over to bring on the Christmas items. The spiritual and worldly are in stark contrast. The Advent season of quiet preparation has to compete with a flurry of activity where we shop, make merry, make cookies, and wear ourselves out in the process. And the Church holds a quiet day in December of all times! 'WHO has time to be quiet?!' Listening and preparing are work, but...worthwhile work.

Our Church celebrates Christmas with a sense of joy and hopefulness; with children sharing in the wonder of the Christmas story; with music and singing; with fellowship and Communion gathering us close to God and one another.

The pace and priorities of our secular world are transformed as we remember the humble birth of a promised Savior and Prince of Peace. May God draw us near as we embrace the promises and hope of that holy night; as we receive and rejoice in his love, joy, and peace. Please invite or bring to Church on Christmas Eve anyone you know who needs such gifts.

Celebrate and share the gifts of God's love, peace, and joy.


