#### FATHERS (AND MOTHERS) AND FRIENDS

They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still. The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.

#### Samuel Isaac Joseph Schereschewsky-October 14

Samuel Schereschewsky was born in Lithuania in 1831. Orphaned at a young age, he was raised by his half-brother who saw his academic gifts and hoped he would become a rabbi. While attending a rabbinical school, he was given a copy of the New Testament in Hebrew that had been produced by the London Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews. His study of the small volume convinced him that Jesus was the Messianic fulfillment of the prophecies of the Old Testament. He left Lithuania and went to Germany to study at Frankfort and later at the University of Breslau. Already fluent in Yiddish, Polish, and Russian, he added German, a language he spoke flawlessly to the end of his days.

In the summer of 1854, he immigrated to America and while in New York City he connected with Christian Jews but did not convert until the following spring. Although baptized a Baptist, he became Presbyterian within months and attended the Western Theological Seminary of the Presbyterian Church. After 2 years, he converted again, this time to the Episcopal Church, and completed his theological education at General Theological Seminary. After he was ordained deacon in 1859, he offered himself for mission work in China. Almost a year after his arrival in China, he was ordained priest in the chapel of the mission school where he taught. This chapel later became the Church of Our Savior, Hongkew. With his gift for languages, it is not surprising that in 1862 he began to translate the Bible into Mandarin Chinese, beginning with the Psalms. This work consumed the next 13 years of his life. In 1877, he was elected Bishop of Shanghai, where he founded St. John's University and began to translate the Bible into Wenli, another major Chinese dialect. After developing Parkinson's disease, he resigned as Bishop of Shanghai in 1884 and continued his translation work. Wheelchair-bound and largely paralyzed by the end of his life, he typed the last 2000 pages of his translation with the one finger he could still move.

Four years before his death in 1906, this extraordinary modern saint said, "I have sat in this [wheel]chair for over twenty years. It seemed very hard at first. But God knew best. He kept me for the work for which I am best fitted." Because of this quotation, Bishop Schereschewsky is also affectionately considered the "patron saint" of the Anglican Communion's internet mailing list, sometimes called the "cyber parish of St. Sam's." He was buried in Tokyo, Japan.

#### **Prayer:**

O God, who in Your providence called Joseph Schereschewsky from his home in Eastern Europe to the ministry of this Church, and sent him as a missionary to China, upholding him in his infirmity, that he might translate the Holy Scriptures into languages of that land: Lead us, we pray, to commit our lives and talents to you, in the confidence that when you give your servants any work to do, you

also supply the strength to do it; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.


#### Sunday, October 11th 2009 CROP Walk
